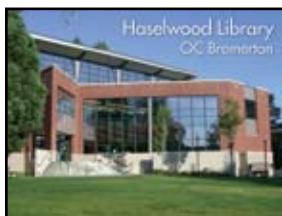

Olympic College is a student-centered community college. Faculty and staff strive to offer a positive, quality learning environment for all. The campus in Bremerton, Washington is located on a 33-acre site framed by views

of the Olympic Mountains, Mt. Rainier, saltwater inlets, and the Cascade Mountains. Classrooms, special instructional areas, computer labs, student center, gym, theater, the Haselwood Library, and other support facilities extend across a friendly, accessible campus.

Olympic College Shelton provides educational opportunities at a convenient 27-acre campus. In addition to the programs that may be completed entirely at this campus, there are an array of college transfer, student services, and workforce development options. The campus offers a bookstore, student government offices, student gathering area, and state-of-the-art library with classrooms, conference rooms, and office space. The library is equipped with fiber optics to provide high tech access, interactive television space, and a teaching computer lab.



Olympic College Poulsbo opened in Winter Quarter 2004. The 39,000-square-foot facility, with views of Liberty Bay and natural landscaping, reflects a distinctive northwest style. The AIA award-winning design features the generous

use of natural light and building materials. A number of programs are available at this campus and include college transfer and professional-technical careers. The campus offers a bookstore, library, student gathering space, and interactive television classrooms. Wireless internet access is available throughout the building.

► Olympic College Overview

Founded in 1946, Olympic College is a public two-year community college that provides education to students in a wide range of ages – from 16 to over 65 years old. The community college system is unique – it provides access to any students that want to attend and helps build important skills for the next phase of their life or career.

Olympic College has a strong reputation for quality and excellence. Highly qualified faculty and staff are committed to providing students with the best educational experience possible. About 25 percent of faculty hold doctorate degrees and all professional-technical faculty have industry experience. Faculty and staff have a variety of enhancement opportunities available to help them maintain high academic standards and professionalism.

The college district – made up of three campuses in Bremerton, Poulsbo and Shelton – serves a population of about 280,000 in Kitsap and Mason counties. In addition to its three college campuses, the institution offers courses at Kitsap Emergency Readiness Center and Naval Base Kitsap – Bangor and Naval Hospital-Bremerton.

In 2007, the Science Technology building opened on the Bremerton campus, providing modern science lab facilities, high-tech computer classrooms, and general purpose classrooms. A new Humanities and Student Services building is under construction and will replace an older building. The new space will create new classrooms, lecture halls, and bring all student services together in one location. The state legislature provided \$39 million to the college for the construction of the structure in 2007.

► Student Programs

Students choose Olympic College to satisfy the first two years of a baccalaureate degree, take classes to prepare for employment, update job skills, and get retraining. In addition, classes are available that help students prepare for college-level studies. A new bachelor of science in nursing degree started in Fall 2007. Enrichment classes, provided through Continuing Education, also offer numerous non-credit classes in a variety of areas of interest to the community.

► Student Services

A number of student services such as counseling, advising, and financial aid and scholarships help individuals with their education at Olympic College. In addition, student programs and activities stimulate learning and development, leadership, and collaboration. A variety of services are available for students of color, veterans, and women. Access Services and adaptive technologies also provide support to students with disabilities.
