

## Online HIV/AIDS Education

### **Bloodborne Pathogens Online Education (WA - Not for STARS credit)**

**Description:**

Designed to provide understanding concerning what bloodborne pathogens are and how to reduce risk of exposure both to oneself and others. OSHA and CDC guidelines are recommended.

**Learning Outcomes:**

1. Define bloodborne pathogens and name the three most common ones.
2. Identify the types of jobs covered by OSHA's Bloodborne Pathogens Standard.
3. List the three most common non-blood fluids that may transmit bloodborne pathogens.
4. Identify the five most common modes of transmission of bloodborne pathogens.
5. Name the three primary areas covered by standard precautions and be able to give specific examples of each.
6. List the three primary steps in handling an exposure incident.
7. Identify the three medical requirements with an exposure.
8. Evaluate your company's Exposure Control Plan.

### **HIV/AIDS (1st Hr)**

**Description:**

Discusses basic etiology and epidemiology of HIV, transmission and infection control, legal and ethical issues, and psychosocial issues. Designed for day-foster-adult care.

**Learning Outcomes:**

1. Identify the stages of progression of HIV.
2. Describe how the virus is and is not transmitted.
3. Practice and promote preventive strategies.

### **HIV/AIDS (2nd Hr)**

**Description:**

Discusses legal and ethical issues, and psychosocial issues. Designed for day-foster-adult care providers.

**Learning Outcomes:**

1. Protect yourself from exposure to HIV.
2. Discuss basic legal and ethical issues surrounding HIV.
3. Discuss psychosocial issues surrounding HIV.
4. Provide support for someone experiencing HIV.

### **HIV/AIDS (3rd & 4th Hr)**

**Description:**

Discusses infection control, legal and ethical issues, and psychosocial issues in more detail than the 2 hour course. Designed for most licensed healthcare providers.

**HIV/AIDS (3rd & 4th Hr)** *(continued)*

**Learning Outcomes:**

1. Protect yourself from exposure to HIV.
2. Discuss basic legal and ethical issues surrounding HIV.
3. Discuss psychosocial issues surrounding HIV.
4. Provide support for someone experiencing HIV.

**HIV/AIDS (5th Hr)**

**Description:**

Discusses testing and counseling. Designed for most licensed healthcare providers.

**Learning Outcomes:**

1. Identify primary screening and confirmatory tests.
2. Discuss who should be tested and why.
3. Define the significance of test results.
4. Describe client-centered counseling.
5. List the four steps for managing referrals.

**HIV/AIDS (6th & 7th Hr)**

**Description:**

Discusses clinical manifestations and treatment. Designed for most licensed healthcare providers.

**Learning Outcomes:**

1. Define the 3 factors in the surveillance case definition for AIDS.
2. Identify unique clinical issues for women and children.
3. Discuss the significance of HAART.
4. List co-infections and describe their significance.
