
College Instruction Center Parking Impacts January 15 – June 22

The College Instruction Center opened Jan. 2. Final stages of the project involve demolishing and converting the old Art, Music and Theater buildings into parking lots. This final phase of the project will result in a **temporary reduction in parking** beginning **Jan. 15 through June 22**.

Beginning Jan 15, the G-3 parking lot (yellow and black striped below) will be closed. To limit the impact of this temporary parking reduction, the college worked with stakeholders to implement the following changes, effective **Jan. 15**:

- Faculty and staff that park in General Parking (G-Lots) will be strongly encouraged to park in Faculty Parking (F-Lots).
- Faculty Parking Lots will be converted to Faculty/Staff Open Parking to accommodate additional use by faculty and staff that use G-Lots.
- Campus Safety will actively patrol these lots and issue citations to anyone without a current employee parking placard
- The College will install clear and visible signage around campus and at the entrances to Staff and Faculty Parking Lots.
- The College will continue finding alternate transportation options for students, faculty and staff throughout the duration of the project.

Parking Placard/Sticker Reference Sheet

The most common parking credentials issued by the college are the Student Parking Sticker, Red Assigned Faculty/Staff Placard, Green General Parking Placard, Blue Adjunct Parking Placard. Below are images of each, with additional details about the locations where they allow you to park during the demolition and conversion of the current art, music and theater building into new parking lots, Jan. 15-June 22.



Student Parking Sticker

This sticker is placed in the rear window in the bottom passenger side.

It allows you to park in any of the General Parking (G-Lots).





General or Blue Faculty/ Staff Parking Placard

This placard is placed on the rear view mirror.

It allows faculty and staff to park in any space in the Assigned Parking "F" Lots during construction, Jan. 15-June 22.

It also allows faculty and staff to park in General Parking (G-Lots) which they are encouraged to **refrain from doing** during construction to provide more parking for students.



Assigned Faculty/Staff Open Parking Placard

This placard is placed on the rear view mirror.

It allows faculty and staff to park in any space in the Assigned Parking "F" Lots during construction, Jan. 15-June 22.

Adjunct Parking Placard

This placard is placed on the rear view mirror.

It allows adjunct faculty to park in any space in the Assigned Parking "F" Lots during construction, Jan. 15-June 22.

Parking Tips and Reminders

- Busiest parking times are 8 a.m.-1 p.m., Monday-Thursday.
- Arrive at least 30 minutes early to ensure you can find a parking space and make it to class on time.
- Use one of our off-campus parking locations which are only a few blocks away.
- Pay attention to parking signs, and driveways when parking on neighborhood streets. Most street parking is 2 hours and local law enforcement will issue tickets.
- Consider alternative transportation options like transit, carpool or bike.
