CHARTERING A CLUB: WICYs OLYMPIC COLLEGE STUDENT CHAPTER KATIE STATED THE CLUB WAS CHARTERED AND SINCE THEY WERE CHARTERED, THEY HAVE HAD 12 STUDENTS INTERESTED IN JOINING THE CLUB. KATIE ENCOURAGES THIS CLUB MOVING FORWARD.

- NEW BUSINESS

\$6,200.00 CRSSA FUND REQUEST FOR BACKPACKS FOR STUDENT-EMPLOYEES:

BRANDON DISCUSSED THAT LAST YEAR'S SGOc RECEIVED \$15,000 WITH THE INTENTION TO USE THOSE FUNDS FOR THE BUDGET HEARINGS, BUT INSTEAD WE RECEIVED THEM AFTER THE ALLOCATIONS WERE MADE. BRANDON SAID WE CAN'T GIVE A GIFT, SO WE WANT TO GIVE A TANGIBLE THANK YOU TO STUDENT EMPLOYEES WHO WORK DURING THE PANDEMIC. SOME BENEFITS OF THESE BACKPACKS ARE THAT THEY COST \$50, BUT WITH THE SCHOOLS DISCOUNT THEY WILL COST \$35 EACH. THE BACKPACKS HAVE MESH ON THE SIDE FOR WATER BOTTLES. BRANDON STATED THAT SGOc WOULD WORK LOCALLY TO GET THE OC LOGO ON TOP OF THE BACKPACK. A REQUEST TO HR WAS MADE TO SEE HOW MANY EMPLOYEES ARE STUDENTS AND BRANDON SAID THE REQUEST IS FOR 130 BACKPACKS. THE FINAL COST FOR THE BACKPACKS IS \$5207.48 AND \$1000 FOR THE EMBROIDERY. THE REQUEST IS \$6200 WITH THE EXCEPTION BEING THAT IF THERE ARE ANY LEFTOVER FUNDS ROSIE ASKED IF THERE'S A POCKET IN THE BACK FOR A COMPUTER. BRANDON STATED THERE IS A BACK PANEL. BRANDON SAID HE CHOSE THIS BACKPACK BECAUSE THERE ARE ENOUGH IN STOCK TO PLACE THE ORDER AT THE MOMENT AND THAT IT DOES HAVE A BACK POCKET THAT SHOULD FIT A COMPUTER. KATIE MADE A MOTION ROSIE SECONDED MOTION CARRIED BRANDON WILL CONTACT JOHN BY FRIDAY TO SAY WE WILL MOVE FORWARD TO APPROVE USING \$6,200 FROM CRRSA TO PURCHASING AND EMBROIDER BACKPACKS. KATIE SECONDED. MOTION CARRIED.
