# **RN-BSN** program

- Program for registered nurses who want to earn a bachelor degree
- Application process is separate from application to Olympic College
- Full time: Can be completed in a few as 4 quarters
- Part time: 2 or 3 year plan



### Admission requirements

- Associate degree in nursing
- 1 year of clinical practice
  - Nursing school clinicals apply
- Current WA State RN licensure
  - Provisional acceptance offered to students in final year of ADN program
  - Must pass NCLEX exam before fieldwork course






### **Nursing Program Mission**

### **Graduation Requirements**

- 45 credits at the 300/400 level
  - 35 credits BNURS as specified
  - 10 credits electives in residence and at the 300/400 level
- General Education requirements
  - 15 credits Humanities
  - 15 credits Social Science
  - 18 credits Natural Science
    - Chemistry, A&P, Microbiology
  - 10 credits Math
    - Statistics and additional College-level Math
- 10 credits foreign language
  - Waiver for 2 years of the same language in HS (with at least a C)

## Residency

- 45 credits of 300-400 level coursework is required by all students to receive a degree from Olympic College.
  - 35 credits of BNURS coursework plus 10 credits of upper division electives
- All 45 credits must be taken from Olympic College

- Completed application form
- Official transcripts from institutions you attended other than OC
- Resume outlining nursing and/or academic clinical experience
- Personal statement about your nursing career
- Three professional references (form included with application materials)
- \$50 application fee (waived for ADN students for 2 years after graduation)
