


Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN) Program

- Application process is separate from the application to Olympic College
- Application is due March 31st each year
- 60 students admitted each year in Fall quarter
- 2 year program, 6 quarters (Fall, Winter, Spring)
- Receive an Associate in Technical Arts degree (Nursing ATA)
- Qualified to take NCLEX to become a registered nurse



What do you need to apply?

- Apply to Olympic College
- Complete Reading Comprehension Accuplacer
- Complete prerequisite and support courses
- Submit all official transcripts
- Complete and submit application

The Accuplacer


New to college?

- Take the entire Accuplacer!
 - Places you for Math and English classes
 - You many need developmental classes. Build the foundation!

Done with prerequisites?

- Take the Reading Comprehension Accuplacer!
 - <u>All</u> applicants must take the Reading Comprehension part of the Accuplacer and submit scores with their application.
 - Minimum score to apply = 260 (Next Generation Accuplacer)





Nursing Prerequisites


Prerequisites give you the knowledge base to make sense of the nursing curriculum.

- Must be complete by March 31st
 - BIOL& 241 Anatomy and Physiology I
 - CHEM& 121 Intro to Chemistry
 - ENGL& 101 Composition I
- Minimum 2.0 GPA required



Required Support Classes

- Required before start of program
 - BIOL& 242 Anatomy and Physiology II
- Required by end of 1st quarter in program
 - NURSE 151 Dosage Calculations (3.7 GPA required)
 - NURSE 152 Intro to Pharmacology (2.2 GPA required)
- Required before start of 2nd year
 - BIOL& 260 Microbiology
 - PSYC& 100 Intro to Psychology or PSYC 102 Psychology of Adjustment
 - NURSE 118 or NUTR& 101 Nutrition
 - One 5 credit elective from the following disciplines:
 - Anthropology, Communication Studies, History, Humanities, Philosophy, Political Science, Sociology




Optional Support Classes

- ENGL& 102 Composition II
- College level Math (other than Statistics)
 - New for 2021 entry
 - Any math class 100-level or above
 - MATH& 107 or MATH& 141




Completion plan for sciences at OC

Transferring Credits

- Who needs to supply transcripts?
 - Anyone who has attended a post-secondary institution.
 - Submit directly to the Admissions office Bremerton campus or <u>evaluators@olympic.edu</u>
 - You must also submit a Transcript Evaluation Request form
 - Not an automatic process!


Out of State Biology and Chemistry?

You need a course review!

 If you took Biology or Chemistry from an out of state college/university (or The Evergreen State College), the credits must be evaluated for equivalency by an Olympic College faculty member

• What's the process?

- Email Ashley at <u>ablake@olympic.edu</u>
- Provide course syllabus and unofficial transcript
- Sent to the science faculty to determine equivalency
- Allow three weeks for results

Other Details

Retaking a class

- OC policy is three attempts; we will take your most recent attempt
 - If it is below a 2.0, you are not eligible
- NURSE 151 (Dosage Calculations): two attempts to get 3.7 or above

Expiration of credits

For nursing, there is no expiration



THE APPLICATION AND THE FACTOR SYSTEM

After you've completed prerequisites...


- Complete the ADN application
 - Application may be submitted when all prerequisite courses are complete – OR – when currently attending last prerequisite course (Winter quarter)
 - Application fee: \$35 paid to the Cashier's office (Waived for rollover candidates)
- Include an official copy of your Accuplacer Reading Comprehension scores.
- Official transcripts from any institution after high school
- DEADLINE is March 31 of the calendar year you wish to enter the program.



The Factor System

- The factor system is points based.
- All courses must be completed by March 31st to receive points
- Cumulative GPA of three prerequisite courses
 - BIOL& 241, CHEM& 121, and ENGL& 101
 - 6 points possible depending on GPA




The Factor System (continued)

- BIOL& 242 = 1 point
- BIOL& 260 = 3 points
- PSYC& 100 or PSYC 102 = 1 point
- ENGL& 102 = 1 point
- NEW College Level Math (other than statistics) = 1 point
- NEW Accuplacer Reading Comprehension Test
 - 260-284 = 1 point, 285-300 = 2 points (Next Generation version)
- Rollover (for applicants who are eligible but not accepted on their first attempt) = 1 point


1st time applicant - 15 points possible

2nd time applicant – 16 points possible



The Factor System (continued)

- Not all required support classes earn factor points
 - NURSE 151 Dosage Calculations
 - NURSE 152 Intro to Pharmacology
 - NURSE 118 or NUTR& 101 Nutrition
 - 5 credit elective
- You will not earn extra factor points for
 - CNA license
 - LPN license (apply to our TADN program instead!)
 - Volunteer or clinical experience
 - Letters of recommendation



Strategy for the rollover point

- Complete the three prerequisite classes
 - ENGL& 101, CHEM& 121, BIOL& 241
- Complete the Accuplacer Reading Comprehension Assessment with at least a 260 score.
- Apply, but do <u>not</u> expect to get in that year.
- The following year you will get a rollover point.
- Complete the rest of the support courses.
- Apply the following year.

The ADN Program: Types of Classes

- One Theory Credit = 1 contact hour per week per credit
 - Lecture and class activities
 - Most classes are 3 credits, so 3 hrs./week
- One Lab Credit = 2 contact hours
 - Practicing Skills
 - Classmates as "patients" (non-invasive!)
- One Clinical Credit = 2 contact hours
 - In a facility like a hospital, care center
 - REAL patients!!
 - Simulations

The ADN Program: Time Commitment


Class time

- 9 credits of theory = 9 hours
- 2 credits of lab = 4 hours
- 3 credits of clinical = 6 hours

Study time

For each hour in class, you need about 2 hours to study





Grades

- Prerequisites
 - Minimum 2.0 GPA
- In program
 - Minimum 2.2 GPA
 - Except NURSE 151 (Dosage Calculations) = 3.7 GPA
- What happens if I don't achieve the required GPA (2.2) in an ADN class?
 - The student will have the option of petitioning the faculty for reentry to the Nursing Program.
 - If a failure in a clinical course occurred due to safety concerns petition for readmission is not an option.



Essential Functions of a Student Nurse


 Students will be asked to perform the essential functions of a student nurse (motor, sensory, communication, cognitive, behavioral/emotional, professional conduct).

Motor duties *may* include:

- Sitting
- Standing
- Walking
- Lifting
- Bending
- Twisting

- Squatting
- Carrying
- Pushing
- Pulling
- Reaching
- Writing

- Typing
- Pinching
- Gripping
- Bimanual dexterity



Essential Functions of a Student Nurse (continued)

- Student nurses are responsible for communication with families, caregivers, and other staff, be it written, verbal, electronic demonstration or other media in relation to their assignment.
- Students must possess emotional health for the adequate use of intellectual abilities.
- Students must possess the ability to reason and practice nursing according to the Professional Code of Ethics.




The ADN Program: Documentation for Clinical Classes

- Students must provide evidence of the following before beginning <u>clinical</u> experiences:
 - BLS for Health Care Providers
 - Malpractice & Liability Insurance
 - Health Insurance
 - Immunizations
 - Background Inquiry



These things are NOT necessary to apply to the program.
It is recommended you wait to hear if you are admitted to the program before gathering these items



Accepting Admission to the ADN Program...

- You must agree to the following conditions that <u>may</u> occur during the two years in the program:
 - Attending classes during the day or evening on weekdays, and even weekends. (Generally due to unusual circumstances.)
 - Participating in clinical experiences day, evening, or night shifts, M-F or on the weekends.
 - Traveling to clinical sites that may be over 50 miles away.
 - Making your program and clinical schedules your top priority, taking precedence over work and personal schedules.
- If you cannot commit to these, please DO NOT ACCEPT your provisional acceptance into the ADN program


