Medical Assistants are multi-skilled practitioners who perform a wide range of roles in physicians' offices and other health care settings performing both administrative and clinical duties.

Medical Billing and Coding Specialists complete various foundation courses for healthcare professionals, as well as specialized courses for insurance billing and coding.

Medical Receptionist students learn to properly greet patients and visitors, make appointments, verify insurance information, use electronic methods to maintain patient records, answer phones and take accurate messages. They will learn to utilize medical terminology and be aware of the implications of federal and state legal guidelines as they apply to ambulatory healthcare settings.

Program Prerequisites

- Accuplacer test scores must place prospective students into Math 099, or students must complete Math 094 with a minimum grade of 2.0 to enter the program.
- Accuplacer English test scores must place prospective students into ENGL&101, or students must complete ENGL 099 with a minimum grade of 2.0 to enter the program.
- Proof of typing proficiency of 35 wpm with 90% accuracy.
- Prior to registration for clinical classes (starting winter term), students must complete an application packet, which will be provided by the MEDA Program Coordinator during MEDA 151. Application deadline: December 1st, or whenever winter quarter classes have filled.

Medical Assisting

Associate In Applied Science -Transfer (91-94 cr)

Graduates of this program are prepared for employment in medical settings to assist physicians or health care providers. This degree program is designed to qualify medical assistants for supervisory and/or management roles that require an associate degree and to allow an opportunity for potential transfer for those who wish to continue their education at a four year institution. To earn this degree, students must also complete the Medical Assisting Certificate of Specialization.

Medical Assisting

Certificate of Specialization (63-64 cr)

Graduates of this program are prepared for employment in ambulatory medical settings assisting physicians or other healthcare professionals in the examination and treatment of patients. Students are taught to perform administrative duties commonly required in healthcare facilities.

Medical Billing and Coding

Certificate of Completion (62-63 cr)

Graduates of this program will be prepared to work as Medical Billing and Coding specialists. This program includes courses for healthcare professionals, as well as specialized courses for insurance billing and coding. Students will be able to translate diseases, conditions, and procedures into numerical designations for insurance. A supervised externship in a medical facility will provide excellent medical billing and coding experience. This program requires a minimum of four quarters for completion and can be completed on a part-time basis.

Medical Receptionist

Certificate of Completion (35-36 cr)

Graduates of this program will be prepared to greet patients and visitors, make appointments, verify insurance, prepare and maintain patient charts, use electronic methods to maintain patient records, answer phones and take accurate messages. They will utilize medical terminology and be aware of federal and state legal guidelines as applied to ambulatory healthcare settings.
