**Opportunities abound for nurses
in a wide variety of settings!**

The Olympic College ADN program offers a two-year curriculum to prepare qualified students to be Registered Nurses. The program is approved by the Washington State Nursing Care Quality Assurance Commission and accredited by the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN).

Graduates of the ADN program earn an Associate in Technical Arts degree which qualifies them to take the NCLEX-RN exam for licensure as a Registered Nurse.

Interested candidates must complete a series of classes prior to program application. Factor points are awarded based on class completion and grades.

Following acceptance to the program, students must complete six quarters of program classwork and maintain a minimum of a 2.2 grade in each class.

4. Accuplacer Reading Comprehension Score of at least 260 (Next Generation).

Note: Classes above may have additional entry requirements.

B. Must be completed with at least a 2.0 grade by the application deadline for extra factor points:

1. PSYCH& 100 - Intro to Psychology
2. BIOL& 242 - Anatomy & Physiology (A&P) II
3. BIOL& 260 - Microbiology
4. Elective 5 cr. See advisor for more information.

2. MATH (&107, &141) (college level, not Statistics)
