Or, The process for certified teachers to waive courses and add a CTE endorsement. Participants will review current research on adolescent brain development and the corresponding relationship to teaching and learning.</p>	<p>CNCTE 008—30 hours with 6 hours FF \$275</p> <p>9981 – History and Philosophy of Career Technical Education Instructor: Claudia Buxton</p> <p>This course explores the history, philosophy, legislation and organizational/curricular structure of career and technical education by examining state and federal legislation and critical reports.</p>	<p>CNCTE 015—6 hours \$59</p> <p>Culminating CTE Teacher Project</p> <p>This culminating course allows the participant to share his/her process of becoming a certified CTE teacher and enhances abilities to present information about CTE programs to varied audiences.
