<p>CNCTE 04—6 clock hours <b>Introduction - CTE Teacher Preparation Program</b> <b>Instructors: Anduiza, M. &amp; Hatfield, S.</b> <b>Times: 9:00 am – 12:00 pm</b> <b>Cost: \$59</b></p> <p>Certified teachers will learn to waive courses and add a CTE endorsement. Business/Industry professionals will gain insight on how to transition from their industry to the CTE classroom/laboratory and attain a CTE certification. All participants will learn to use Canvas as an online learning platform.</p> <p><b>*Class continues via Canvas until July 17</b></p>	<p>CNCTE 08—30 clock hours <b>CTE History and Philosophy</b> <b>Instructor: Buxton, C.</b> <b>Times: 9:00 am – 12:00 pm</b> <b>Cost: \$358</b></p> <p>This course explores the historical foundations on which today's CTE principles and philosophies are built, from pre-and early 1900's when it was called 'vocational education.'</p> <p>It also looks at key vocational education leaders such as Charles Prosser and Carl Perkins, societal influences, national and state legislative and funding issues, Smith-Hughes Act and the Carl Perkins acts as well as current initiatives.</p> <p><b>*Class continues via Canvas until Aug 5</b></p>	<p>CNCTE 07—30 clock hours <b>Student Leadership/Development</b> <b>Instructors: Waller, J.</b> <b>Times: 9:00 am – 12:00 pm</b> <b>Cost: \$358</b></p> <p>This course focuses on the required CTE student participation in a Career Technical Student Organization (CTSO) or appropriate leadership activities within CTE classes.</p> <p>Participants will review current research on adolescent brain development, the relationship to teaching and learning, the Social Emotional Learning Standards, and how the integration into student leadership curriculum development.</p> <p>Participants will also become familiar with CTE youth organizations, the state advisor and contact process, and the 21st Century Skills component of course frameworks.</p> <p><b>* Class will continue via Canvas until Aug 5</b></p>	<p>CNCTE 09—20 clock hours <b>Occupational Analysis and Skills Standards</b> <b>Instructors: Gutmann, C.</b> <b>Times: 9:00 am – 12:00 pm</b> <b>Cost: \$241</b></p> <p>Participants will examine current labor market information and skills standards for program development and student's programs of study leading to certification.</p> <p>Discover resources and tools for classroom use to investigate and research information related to career connections matching student's interests and attitudes.</p> <p><b>* Class will continue via Canvas until Aug 5</b></p>	<p><b>Prerequisite for enrollment in the Culminating Project: <u>ALL</u> courses must be either completed or waived.</b></p> <p>CNCTE 15—6 clock hours <b>Culminating Project - CTE</b> <b>Cost: \$59</b></p> <p>This course allows participants to share their process of becoming a certified CTE teacher and to celebrate program completion with others.</p> <p>Participants will review their individual path to CTE certification--occupational experience and key learnings from CTE courses.</p> <p>This course serves as a measure of the teacher candidate's ability to present information about CTE programs to varied audiences.</p> <p><b>Enrollment in the culminating project is <u>individually arranged</u>.</b></p>
<p>CNCTE 11—10 clock hours <b>Safety - CTE Classroom</b> <b>Instructor: Hatfield, S.</b> <b>Times: 1:00 pm – 4:00 pm</b> <b>Cost: \$124</b></p> <p>This course emphasizes the establishment and maintenance of a safe learning environment and the ability to teach safety skills in a career technical environment—classroom and shop. Participants will be introduced to resources available from OSPI, the Department of Labor and other local/state/federal private and public agencies.</p> <p><b>*Class continues via Canvas until July 17</b></p>
