B. New Business –

- Music Department Budget:** The music department is very adamant about having scholarships within the music department. We have talked about how we want to support them in this. If Vocal and Instrumental were to freeze their accounts for the remainder of this year, we would fund a total of \$50,000 for scholarships next year. With what they have remaining, we would only have to add about \$13,000 to the budget to reach the 50 thousand. Due to concerns of mismanagement, this fund will now be managed by Rebecca Seaman. This will only happen tentatively for two years, the Foundation will be setting up a self-sustaining scholarship for music, that is being projected to be ready. We will stop funding operation costs. Eligibility for student recipients will be stipulated per the attached draft. There’s concerns about how financial aid is going to be handling their funds for the students. It looks like we may need to have a conversation with Financial Aid before we implement this scholarship. If we stop funding travel, the programs will have to fundraise to leave. In the draft, we are changing the third bullet under ‘Music’ to “SGOC will no longer provide funds for travel or operation for now through June of 2019”. Motioned by Nic, seconded by Jayne
