- **SGOC Vice President of Poulsbo: VACANT** – Shannon was out there last week. It's an exciting campus. There are issues out there that needs to be addressed from foodbanks, vending machines, clubs, and homelessness. The students are searching for engagement.
- **SGOC Vice President of Shelton: Susan Ronald**- Had a very busy week last week. Was able to help students get books, supplies, and food. Things are starting to settle down. She didn't get any surveys done. This is the last week for the bookstore but it's not really stocked. A lot of the students are on worker retraining. The money is stuck only in the bookstore so they are stuck with where they can get their textbooks. There is a supply of school supplies that has been a huge help. There are no food vending machines and there's nothing in the bookstore. They only brought in two vending machines. Neither of them are currently working. The coffee machine has been taken away. They need sandwiches for students to eat. They are struggling. Sent the Jake French contract to Jayne. Jayne will be out there tomorrow and will set up a time for a financial aid seminar for students in Shelton as well.

Potential lending library in Shelton so students can sit down in a common area and work on homework. Katrina will have to reschedule her meeting with Suzy regarding clubs because their meeting falls on OC Connect.

- **SGOC Advisor: Faviola Barbosa**- New timestation cards have been sent out to be made. Jayne is going back and forth for transportation for OC connect. Destiny will be managing volunteers.

So far everyone is on board for the Welcome Back BBQ. We will be setting up a meeting with Jodie to make sure roles are defined. The dress code for the BBQ will be black first and jeans. For OC connect the dress code will be OC shirts and jeans with our name tags.

We will be putting together an application for the Diversity Conference in LA. 5-6 students will be selected or appointed out of the club officers.
