Social and human service assistant is a general term for people with a wide array of job titles, including human service worker, case management aide, social work assistant, community support worker, mental health aide, community outreach worker, life skill counselor, or gerontology aide. They usually work under the direction of workers from a variety of fields, such as nursing, psychiatry, psychology, rehabilitative therapy, physical therapy, or social work.

Social and human service assistants perform a plethora of duties, serving both the employers and the clients. They act as a prime support system for social workers and clients alike. Serving under a manager or social worker, social and human service assistants are responsible for recording and tracking client progress and reporting their findings. They arrange for transportation and escorts, if necessary, and provide emotional support for their clients. As an important member of the social and human services team, they are able to impact many lives positively.

Chemical Dependency Counseling Associate in Technical Arts (90 cr)

This degree is designed for students who wish to fulfill the education requirements for certification as Chemical Dependency Professionals through the Department of Health in Washington State (WAC 246-811-030).

Chemical Dependency Professional Certificate of Proficiency (51-55 cr)

This program is designed for students who wish to fulfill the education requirements for certification as Chemical Dependency Professionals through the Department of Health in Washington State (WAC 246-811-030).

Human Services-Case Aid Certificate of Recognition (19 cr)

The program prepares students to enter the field as entry-level case aides or assistants in agencies working with a diverse range of clients

Chemical Dependency Certification with Alternative Training (Fast Track) Certificate of Completion (20 cr)

This program is designed for students who wish to become a certified Chemical Dependency Professional in Washington State. Only professionals listed in WAC 246-811-076 are eligible for certification through alternative training. Eligible practitioners include and are limited to the following: Advanced registered nurse practitioner, marriage and family therapist, mental health counselor, advanced social worker or independent clinical social worker, psychologist, osteopathic physician, osteopathic physician assistant, physician, or physician assistant. Practitioners must already hold an active license to be eligible for this training.
