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Part 1: Application Timeline

The Application Deadline

The Practical Nursing application deadline is August 31st. Application and all supporting documents must be received by the deadline. Applicants are strongly encouraged to apply as soon as they are eligible.

Applicants may submit application and all supporting documents when:

All prerequisites are completed or will be completed by the deadline.

1. ENGL& 101- English Composition I
2. PSYC& 100 – Introduction to Psychology
3. BIOL& 241 – Anatomy and Physiology I
4. BIOL 242 – Anatomy and Physiology II

AND they are registered for the following courses:

5. NURSE 152 - Pharmacology
6. NURSE 151 – Dosage Calculation.

- Official Accuplacer Reading Comprehension Proficiency Test scores. Reading scores from any other placement exams will not be accepted.
- Official transcripts from **ALL** colleges directly to the Office of Admissions. Even if the course(s) was from a non-accredited school, was taken for “no credit”, or is not applicable to nursing, you must submit ALL transcripts. You must provide an official transcript from **each** school you have attended; simply showing transferred courses on one transcript will not be considered.
- If you took Advanced Placement courses taken in high school, you must submit a copy of your scores from the College Board.
- If courses are in-progress summer quarter, and you are attending a school other than Olympic College, you will be required to submit official transcripts as soon as summer grades are posted; no later than September 15th. Failure to do so will make your application ineligible.
- Transcript Evaluation Request if submitting transcripts other than those from Olympic College.
- Verification of Washington State NAC license, if applicable.

Part 3: Application Process

Admission Procedure

Application to the Practical Nursing Program is a separate process from the application to Olympic College. Enrollment in the Practical Nursing Program is limited; therefore admission to Olympic College does not guarantee admission to the Practical Nursing Program. **Formal application to the Practical Nursing Program should be made when the applicant has completed or is registered for his/her last prerequisite course.** The Practical Nursing Application **MUST** be received **NO LATER THAN** August 31st of the academic the year the applicant anticipates entering the Practical Nursing Program. The program is open to men and women and is a fulltime program. The program admits students, **winter quarter** only. Admission is based on a factoring system.

Admission Requirements

- 1) Fluency in the English language (reading comprehension and writing); a necessary requirement for licensure as a nurse.
- 2) Completion of the following prerequisite courses with a minimum grade of 2.0 in each course: BIOL& 241 AND 242, ENGL&101, AND PSYC&100.
- 3) Achieve at 260 on the Accuplacer Next Generation Reading Assessment. Contact the Assessment and Testing Center at www.olympic.edu/accuplacer to schedule. The Reading Comprehension Test is required for ALL applicants regardless of background or previous degrees.
- 4) Applicants must have completed NURSE 151 and NURSE 152 or be registered in them for fall quarter at the time of the application deadline. Minimum grade requirements: **NURSE 151 must be completed with a 3.7 or above.** NURSE 152 must be completed with a 2.2 (80%) or above.

The **application** and supporting documents must be received no later than August 31st.

Courses completed **summer** quarter with the required grade of 2.0 or better will be included in the student's file as required for winter admission consideration.

Incomplete applications will not be accepted.

All application materials become the property of Olympic College. We are not responsible for email or fax error.

The applicant is responsible for verifying that all required documentation has been received by the Office of Admissions. Applications and transcripts received after August 31st *will not* be considered for admission to the program for that year. Applications will be reviewed in the order in which they are received.

Part 4: Course Review Process

Who Needs to Complete a Course Review?

If you took your **sciences** (Chemistry or Biology with a lab, or Anatomy and Physiology I and II) out-of-state, or from The Evergreen State College, you will need to complete a course review. A course review requires the following:

1. Syllabi (not course description) with lab component clearly listed and
2. Unofficial transcript showing the listed courses and grade received to the Nursing Programs Administrative Office via email to nursing@olympic.edu .
 - Organic/Biological Chemistry (if required as prerequisite)

Please keep all original documents for yourself, and turn in copies via the course review form. This form is located under the FAQs on the nursing homepage at www.olympic.edu/nursing at the right side of the screen.

If you took **nursing** courses at another college or university other than Olympic College, you will also need to get a course review, by providing the syllabi and unofficial transcripts to the Nursing Advisor via email ablake@olympic.edu. This requirement applies to the following classes :

1. Medical Terminology
2. Dosage Calculations
3. Pharmacology
4. Nutrition

ALL course review documents must be submitted **before the August 31st deadline**

Part 5: Selection of Applicants

The Factor System

The factor system is points based. Factor points will only be awarded if courses/requirements are completed by the August 31st deadline. **If you retake a course, we will use the most recent attempt.** Acceptance into the Practical Nursing Program is based on total points earned:

- 1) Cumulative GPA of Prerequisite Courses (ENGL& 101, PSYC& 100, BIOL& 241 and BIOL& 242).

Note: A minimum grade of 2.0 must be earned in each prerequisite course.

- 2) Support Course Completion

- 3) Current Washington State NAC verification **1 point**
- 4) Roll-over (for applicants who are eligible but not accepted on their first attempt).
The rollover point will be awarded one time only. **1 point**

Applicants are ranked according to total number of factor points. In the event of a tie, the following tie breakers will be used:

- 1st Tie Breaker: Combined **GPA** of prerequisite courses
- 2nd Tie Breaker: Number of support courses completed by August 31st
- 3rd Tie Breaker: Combined **GPA** of the support courses
- 4th Tie Breaker: Overall cumulative **GPA** for all colleges attended

Recommendations for Student Success

- 1) Completion of one year each of high school algebra, biology, and chemistry or equivalents.
- 2) **Work experience** in the health care field (either paid or volunteer) is encouraged.

Additional Information

- 1) Admissions are granted for a particular quarter and year. Students not enrolling for the specific quarter and year (as noted in their letter of acceptance) **must** submit a new application for the Practical Nursing Program by the August 31st deadline.
- 2) Students eligible for current year class but not admitted, **must** submit a new application for the Practical Nursing Program by the August 31st deadline.
- 3) Students who have been offered admission into the Practical Nursing Program will be required to attend **mandatory** orientation sessions prior to the beginning of winter quarter.

Students with Previous Nursing Education

Students who have completed some formal nursing education must complete prerequisite coursework

and meet grade requirements, and are required to enter in to the applicant pool. If accepted to the Practical Nursing Program, previous coursework may be reviewed to determine advanced standing.

Access Support Services

Olympic College is committed to providing access to higher education for students with disabilities. Any student with a permanent or temporary disability is encouraged to contact Access Support Services at (360) 475-7540 to discuss appropriate accommodations.

Background Inquiry

A National background inquiry completed by Certified Backgrounds is required to disclose any history of criminal record or abusive behavior (Child/Adult Abuse Information Act, RCW; 43.43.830 through 43.43.840). If the results of this information cause any clinical agency to deny you privileges to rotate through that agency, withdrawal from the Practical Nursing Program will be required.

Re-entering Olympic College Practical Nursing Students

Reentering Olympic College Practical Nursing students must submit a Practical Nursing Admissions Application and credential requirements to be eligible to re-enroll.

- Fall/Winter Re-enter deadline is March 31st
- Spring/Summer Re-enter deadline is August 31st

Part 6: Post Application Submission Process

Office of Admissions Timelines

- 1) Practical Nursing Admissions Application and all supporting documents must be submitted to the Office of Admissions by August 31st.
 - a) Practical Nursing Admissions Applications **received after August 31st** will not be considered for the upcoming cohort.
 - b) All students whose application materials (prerequisites and required documentation) are not complete will need to **REAPPLY** for next year's class.
- 2) Applicant files will be reviewed by the Office of Admissions. A letter will be sent to applicants advising them of any missing documents. **Applications turned in within the last three weeks of August that are missing documents are not guaranteed to receive notification from the Admissions Office prior to the application deadline. Any documents missing from your application packet will make your application ineligible for that year. Applicants must be eligible in order to receive a rollover point. Therefore, applicants are strongly encouraged to submit their application materials as soon as they are eligible to apply.**
- 3) The Practical Nursing Admissions Committee will meet after the deadline to determine the winter class for admission.
- 4) The admission letters for the PN program will be sent via email (that you list on your application) and/or by US mail by the Admissions Department (not the Nursing Program). Students will receive notification of their status prior to December 1st.
 - a) **Please allow three weeks for processing.**
 - b) **If you have not received notification of your status during that time you may contact the Admission Department at 360-475-7206.**

Eligible applicants who are not admitted, must submit a new application by the August 31st deadline for the following year. It is not necessary to resubmit official transcripts unless additional classes have been taken at institutions outside of Olympic College.

Part 8: Practical Nursing Program Clinical Experiences

The Olympic College Practical Nursing Program includes clinical experiences in patient care at cooperating health care facilities. The clinical agencies require students to provide evidence of the following prior to beginning clinical experiences.

- 1) Current immunizations, uploaded to and confirmed by Certified Background Check and Immunization Tracker;
- 2) Basic Life Support for Health Care Providers Certification (American Heart Association for the Healthcare Provider) must be **annually** updated while in the Practical Nursing Program;
- 3) Non-refundable liability and malpractice insurance (must be purchased through Olympic College) is required; and
- 4) Proof of personal health insurance;
- 5) Learning module completion;
- 6) Completion of the Certified Background check within acceptable parameters of clinical agencies.

Please do not turn in documents pertaining to items 1-6 above with your application. We recommend that all applicants wait to hear if they have been formally admitted in to the Practical Nursing program prior to starting on the documentation process. Those applicants accepted in to the Practical Degree Nursing Program, will be required to attend a mandatory orientation regarding the required documentation.

Applicants who have chronic health conditions or disabilities which require alterations to the program of study as approved by the Washington State Nursing Care Quality Assurance Commission, or which prevent the practice of Practical Nursing with reasonable skill and safety, should be aware of the possibility that they may not be eligible to sit for the NCLEX licensing examination or obtain a license to practice Nursing.
